XXXXXXX	EXCURSION	BOHOL CITY & PANGLAO TOUR	Tagbilaran, the City of Friendship, the gateway to the province. Drive thru a simple and laid-back city, unruffled by the rigors and pressures in big cities. Walk down Sitio Ubos (old Tagbilaran). Visit the Blood Compact Site where the commemorative marker of the first international treaty of friendship was made. After the city tour, hop on to an island, where sun, sand and sea lovers would have a great time in the beaches of Panglao. See an eerie underworld of stalactites and stalagmites of Hinagdanan Cave with sunlight piercing through natural openings above a pool of placid water. Cap it all with a farm tour at the Bohol Bee Farm, a farm serving honey-based cooking and organically-grown vegetables for lunch.	-Blood Compact -Panglao Island -Hinagdana Cave		
XXXXXXX	EXCURSION	FASCINATING BOHOL TOUR WITH LOBOC RIVER CRUISE AND LUNCH	Leave your resort early in the morning for a day trip that will introduce you to the wonders of Bohol. First stop is the Philippine Tarsier Foundation in the town of Corella, which serves as a refuge for the smallest primate in the world, the tarsier. Observe these rare, nocturnal creatures in their natural habitat and be amazed by their agility as they move about, leaping from one tree to the other, and swivel their heads nearly 360 degrees. Then proceed to Baclayon, make a short stop at the historical Blood Compact site, where Spain's Miguel Lopez de Legazpi and Datu Sikatuna, a native chieftain, sealed their friendship with a symbolic drink. In Baclayon, visit a centuries-old stone church that houses a museum containing a collection of religious art, ecclesiastical vestments, as well as librettos of church music inscribed in Latin on animal skins. Proceed with the tour, passing by Bilar man-made forest, a thick undergrowth of towering mahogany trees grown on the fringes of the highway leading to the Chocolate Hills, the country's geological wonder. From a distance, these hills look like huge candy drops that change in color with the season, and are aptly named 'chocolate' when the hill grasses turn deep brown in summer. Hike up to the viewpoint for a bird's eye view of the surrounding area before moving on to Loboc River where a cruise downstream on a floating restaurant is made more enjoyable with a delectable lunch served on board. XXXXXXX	EXCURSION	PAMILACAN ISLAND TOUR WITH LUNCH	Pamilacan Island - a gem of an island long destined to become a beachcomber's haven and a diver's playground. In the island is a 150-meter wide fish sanctuary that is home to schools of groupers, snappers, tuna and mackerel. The waters of Pamilacan also serve as pathways for migrating dolphins and whales. Get a chance to catch a glimpse of these sea mammals at the rear of the island. The village chapel and a Spanish-built military outpost which served as a lookout for marauding pirates looms ahead as one approaches the island. Topping off these welcoming sights is a picnic lunch that caps a well-spent day. XXXXXXX	EXCURSION	BALICASAG ISLAND TOUR WITH LUNCH	A 25-hectare islet off the mainland of Panglao that is famous for its dive sites is Balicasag Island. The island is accessible by a 35-minute boat ride from the mainland. Crystal clear blue waters ideal for snorkeling greet each visitor as he nears the island, with underwater formations and tropical fishes visible from as low as two feet deep. Tour the island on foot and visit the village.
