XXXXXXXX	EXCURSION	CEBU CITY TOUR WITHOUT LUNCH	Cebu City's reputation as one of the country's top tourist destinations is due to its all year round warm climate and accessibility. Named as the country's second international gateway, Cebu is rich in history, and is the oldest city (1565) in the Philippines. The city tour starts with a visit to the majestic Taoist Temple. Situated 6 km from the city centre is this impressive and highly ornate temple of the Taoist religious community. Its size and architecture are evidence that a considerable part of Cebu's population is ethnically Chinese. On the way to the Basilica, pass by Cebu's Provincial Capital and Carbon Market. Stop by the Basilica de San Agustin, which houses the statue of the Infant Jesus. A short walk away is Magellan's Cross, the place where Christianity was first planted in Cebu. Not far away is Fort San Pedro, the first military stronghold in the country. Proceed to Casa Gorordo, the last stop of the tour. The Parian district in today's downtown area was the residential home of Cebu's and furnished in the style of the period. 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XXXXXXXX	EXCURSION	TWIN CITY DISCOVERY TOUR WITHOUT LUNCH	Filipinos are known to be musically inclined people and for this tour the first jump-off of the tour will be the remarkable guitar makers of Cebu, the Alegre Guitar Factory. Witness the artistry of Guitar making by knowing different types, colors and materials used for making well-crafted guitars that are also being exported to other countries. Next stop is in Cebu City, Mactan Shrine, where the Cebuano's repulsed the Spanish invaders and where Magellan was killed. Fort San Pedro is a military defense built by the Spanish to keep them safe from the Muslim raiders. Take a post at Magellan's Cross, this was planted by Magellan that marked Filipino's Catholic faith. Then afterwards we will get to shout Viva Sto. Nino!!! at Basilica Minore del Sto. Nino, the country's oldest Roman Catholic Church and serves as cradle to Cebu's famous Sto. Nino. Strike a pose at Cebu heritage Monument, this is a tableau of sculptures made of concrete, bronze, brass and steel showing scenes about events and structures related to the history of Cebu. We will also take you to a museum hopping where the first stop is the Yap San Diego, considered as one of the oldest existing structural residential houses in the Philippines. It was constructed by a family of Chinese merchants sometime in the late 17th century. Next stop is Casa Gorordo, once home of Juan Gorodo, first Filipino Bishop of Cebu. The museum houses many old and ancient relics. The last stop for this tour is the Toist Temple, a cultural centre of the Chinese minority where you will get to see dragon paintings, altars and statues of the Buddha combines with beautiful pagoda roofs and a pool embellished with lotus flowers right outside of the Temple.		
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XXXXXXXX	EXCURSION	ISLAND SWING WITH LUNCH	Your adventure begins when our guide escorts you to where you get aboard a motorized outrigger Banca to discover the underwater jewels of Cebu's blue waters, in the course of the tour, we drop an anchor to give you an opportunity to swim and snorkel, and enjoy Cebu's underwater attractions before moving on to a nearby island for a sumptuous lunch. XXXXXXXX	EXCURSION	BOJO RIVER CRUISE	This tour will allow you to experience a unique eco-cultural river cruise. Learn more about mangroves and get enchanted by the stories of local guide during the cruise. Stories like mythical beings coexisting in the river such as the story of local folklore "Maria Tang-an". This and other stories will make the cruise more interesting. The river is home to 22 species of mangroves and also a home to 71 species of birds, some of which are migratory. It is a fishing village on the Midwest part of Cebu and one of the 15 Barangays in Aloguinsan. 'Bojo' is a Spanish word which means coastal sailing or trading. Bojo River spans about 1.4 kilometers from the starting point up to the river mouth and cruising duration is about an hour. XXXXXXXX	EXCURSION	MOALBOAL AND MANTAYUPAN FALLS	Leave the city early morning and travel to the town of Barili for your first stop. About few kilometers away from town proper of Barili is the 98-meter Mantayupan Falls. Mantayupan Falls the highest waterfall in Cebu locally known as "Ambakan" surrounded by lush greenery. An hour away from Barili is a small coastal town situated southwest of Cebu, Moalboal. This place is famous for sardine run and its beautiful marine biodiversity. Get ready to swim with millions of sardines in Moalboal, a true haven for scuba divers. One may encounter reef fishes like sweetips, tangs, gobies and lionfish. Non-divers are welcome as well, with the house reef offering a breathtaking drop-off with abundant marine life. XXXXXXXX	EXCURSION	BOHOL DAYTRIP WITH LOBOC RIVER CRUISE AND LUNCH (WITH BUSINESS CLASS FERRY TICKETS)	Take an early ferry to Bohol for a day trip that will introduce you to the wonders of Bohol. First stop is the Philippine Tarsier Foundation in the town of Corella, which serves as a refuge for the smallest primate in the world, the tarsier. Observe these rare, nocturnal creatures in their natural habitat and be amazed by their agility as they move about, leaping from one tree to the other, and swivel their heads nearly 360 degrees. Then proceed to Baclayon, make a short stop at the historical Blood Compact site, where Spain's Miguel Lopez de Legazpi and Datu Sikatuna, a native chieftain, sealed their friendship with a symbolic drink. In Baclayon, visit a centuries-old stone church that houses a museum containing a collection of religious art, ecclesiastical vestments, as well as librettos of church music inscribed in Latin on animal skins. Proceed with the tour, passing by Bilar man-made forest, a thick undergrowth of towering mahogany trees grown on the fringes of the highway leading to the Chocolate Hills, the country's geological wonder. From a distance, these hills look like huge candy drops that change in color with the season, and are aptly named 'chocolate' when the hill grasses turn deep brown in summer. Hike up to the viewpoint for a bird's eye view of the surrounding area before moving on to Loboc River where a cruise downstream on a floating restaurant is made more enjoyable with a delectable lunch served on board.
