| XXXXXXX | EXCURSION | MANILA TOUR BY JEEPNEY | Enjoy an extraordinary experience that is uniquely Filipino by riding in an airconditioned jeepney whilst taking in the sights of Manila. Travel through the financial district of Makati, passing down Ayala Avenue with gleaming skyscrapers. Continue to the bustling metropolis of Manila, past the Cultural Center of the Philippines and on to Roxas Boulevard along Manila Bay. Stop at Rizal Park, named after the country's hero, Dr. Jose Rizal. Then proceed to the Walled City of Intramuros which was the nucleus of the old Spanish town. Venture into Fort Santiago in its strategic location overlooking the Pasig River and Manila Bay and stroll along its ramparts. Continue to San Agustin Church, the only church built within Intramuros that has survived the collective onslaught of numerous calamities. Beside the church is a museum that houses a collection of manuscripts, rare books, and religious arts and artifacts. Across the San Agustin Church is Casa Manila, a reproduction of a 19th century house equipped with oriental and European décor, as well as Philippine antique furniture. | XXXXXXX | EXCURSION | EXPLORING OLD MANILA | The tour starts with a visit to Rizal Park, named in honor of the country's national hero, Dr. Jose Rizal. After a brief picture stop, proceed to the Walled City of Intramuros to visit the remnants of Spain's conquistadores. Stop at Fort Santiago, an old Spanish fortress located at the mouth of Pasig River, where great moments in Philippine history occurred. Travel through the cobbled streets to San Agustin Church, the country's oldest stone church, and view its wide collection of ecclesiastical icons, vestments and other religious articles. Cross the street to Casa Manila, a reproduction of a 19th century house equipped with oriental and European décor, as well as Philippine antique furniture. Then board a horse drawn carriage called 'calesa' and trot off to Chinatown in Binondo, crossing the Pasig River, and onto an alley that leads you to Binondo Church, another historical landmark built by the Spaniards in 1596. Alight at the church's entrance for a brief stop, and walk towards Ongpin, a street visit Chinese style arches at its entrance. This narrow street leads to a network of alleys and side streets crammed with small shops, Chinese drugstores, restaurants and residential houses. Binondo's commercial activity ranges from banks to retail and wholesale shops selling a variety of items, from Chinese curios and delicacies to textiles, jewelries and construction materials. A leisurely walk brings you to numerous gold jewelry shops at the other end of Ongpin, whereupon sits an old Spanish fountain near the entrance to Sta. Cruz Church. Stop briefly at Sta. Cruz Church that was built in 1608 by the Jesuit priests, then move on to Escolta, located a few blocks away. Steep in history, it was once used as a convoy route by the British Navy from 1762 to 1764, and the shopping center of the elite during the Spanish and American regimes. Today, what is left of what was once known as the "Queen of Streets' are two notable pre-World War II buildings, the Regina Building and the Perez-Samanillo Building. 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| xxxxxxx | EXCURSION | MANILA THE LOCAL WAY | Acquire a deeper understanding of the country's culture and learn to appreciate it in all its diversity. Join a tour of the capital like no other and feel the pulse of the city as the day goes by. Observe local color as you venture out in the morning on a ferry ride along Pasig River, a major tidal estuary of Manila Bay. Experience and be like the locals when they travel to work by riding the jeepney, PNR train and a 3-wheeled motorbike known as the 'kuliglig' or the 'tricykad'. Take a trip around the old walls of Intramuros in a horse-drawn carriage called 'calesa', and watch history unfold before your eyes as your cochero points out interesting landmarks along the way. Continue on to Chinatown in Binondo where you walk the whole length of the street full of herbal stores, jewelry shops and other oriental knick-knacks. Drop by an authentic Chinese tea house for some refreshments before finally hailing a 'tricykad' to the Philippine National Railway Station, the country's oldest commuter rail service that was established in 1892. The tour ends with a train ride back to Buendia Station, passing through one of the country's most densely populated areas. 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| XXXXXXX | EXCURSION | HIDDEN VALLEY TOUR WITH LUNCH | Discover a paradise, neatly hidden between two mystical mountains. Hidden Valley is a 44-hectare crater, some 900 meters deep that was formed during fiery volcanic upheaval thousands of years ago. From the cracks more than a hundred springs of varying temperature came to life forming natural pools with the purest mineral waters believed to be medicinal and rejuvenating. Trees and plants emerged from the shadowy heart of the crater, which undisturbed for centuries went on to become giants reaching for the sunlight. On the far side of the crater the earth opened into a gorge creating hidden waterfalls. Listen to the rhythm and sounds of swaying palms and ferns accompanied by the gently cascading waters gushing forth from the mountainside. Hidden Valley is home to at least 153 species of flora, most of which are endemic. The abundant greens, blooms and foliage crowned by 300-year old Amlang trees are a glorious sight. Amongst the foliage a number of paths link numerous spring-fed pools where you can relax and enjoy these wonderful surroundings. Swimming or lazing by the pools is the main activity here.
